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INTRODUCTION



The Country

Officially known as the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, Viet Nam is the easternmost country on the Indochina Peninsula in Southeast Asia with an estimated 95 million people. Viet Nam is bordered by China to the north, Laos to the northwest, Cambodia to the southwest, and the East Sea to the east. Its capital city is Hanoi.

Viet Nam had been under the Chinese domination for over a millennium, from 111 BC to AD 939 before it regained the independence in 939. The successive Vietnamese royal dynasties flourished as the nation expanded geographically and politically into Southeast Asia, until the Indochina Peninsula was colonized by the French in the mid-19th century. Following a Japanese occupation in the 1940s, the Vietnamese fought French rule in the First Indochina War, eventually expelling the French in 1954.

Thereafter, Viet Nam was divided politically into two rival states, North and South Viet Nam. The conflict between the two sides intensified in what is known as the Viet Nam War. The war ended with a North Vietnamese victory in 1975. Viet Nam was then unified under a communist government but remained impoverished and politically isolated. In 1986, the government initiated a series of economic and political reforms which began Viet Nam's path towards integration as a rising economic player.

Currently Viet Nam is totally different from it was before.

People & Language

Vietnam is a multiethnic country with over fifty distinct groups (54 are recognized by the Vietnamese government), each with its own language. lifestyle, and cultural heritage. The official language is Vietnamese, which is used widely by most of people. Many of the local ethnic groups residing in mountain areas are known collectiv ely as Montagnard or hill tribe peoples. The largest ethnic groups are: Kinh (Viet) 86.2%, Tay 1.9%, Thai Ethnic 1.7, Muong 1.5%, KhmerKrom 1.4%, Hoa 1.1%, Nung 1.1%, Hmong 1%, others 4.1%. Despite their differences, all the groups live in harmony. Vietnamese people are famous for their friendliness, hospitability, and tolerance, which have been touching many people's hearts for centuries.

Economy

After the war in 1975, Viet Nam encountered many serious economic problems, which included small-scale production, low labor productivity, unemployment, material and technological short comings, and insufficient food and consumer goods.

But now, there have been dramatic changes, thanks largely to the recent reforms; Viet Nam has got a market economy and has been one of the world's fastest growing economies in the world. The main industry is agriculture, fishery, manufacturing, information technology, and high-tech industries. Viet Nam is also ranked as the 8th largest crude petroleum producers in the Asia and Pacific region. In addition, the tourism plays a significant role in this beautiful country, which attracts millions of tourists every year.


Currency

The currency in Viet Nam is Dong (VND). The ATM is almost everywhere in the cities. Or you can change the money at the banks upon arrival either at the airport or near the hotels. The current exchange rate is 1.00 USD = about 22,000VND (applied in 2016). The US dollars and Euro are accepted in daily transactions.











Tourism

Thanks largely to its friendly and hospitable people, long history, rich culture and stunning natural landscapes, Viet Nam has been known to be a safe and popular destination for many tourists. The most popular tourist destinations include Hanoi, Sapa, landscapes in the northwest and the northeast, the World Heritage Sites such as Ha Long Bay, Phong Nha-Ke Bang National Park, Hue Ancient Capital, Hoi An and My Son Sanctuary. The country and its people are doing the best to make the tourism a key industry of the economy. Numerous tourist projects are currently being constructed to meet the increasing demands of the quests.

Accommodation

Modern hotels in terms of both quantity and quality are available almost everywhere. The price varies according to the location and the luxury. More and more hotels are currently under construction to meet the demands of the tourists.

Food

Due to the differences in terms of weather, geography and the various influences, Vietnamese cuisine traditionally features a combination of five fundamental taste elements: spicy (metal), sour (wood), bitter (fire), salty (water) and sweet (earth). Common ingredients include fish sauce, shrimp paste, soy sauce, rice, fresh herbs, fruits and vegetables.

Vietnamese recipes use lemongrass, ginger, mint, Vietnamese mint, long coriander, Saigon cinnamon, bird's eye chili, lime and basil leaves. Traditional Vietnamese cooking is known for its fresh ingredients, minimal use of oil, and reliance on herbs and vegetables, and is considered one of the healthiest cuisines worldwide. The most popular Vietnamese dishes are: Pho (Noodle soup), Nem (spring-rolls), and seafood.

In addition, Viet Nam is home to many tropical fruits, which are so juicy and tasty such as mangoes, litchi, plums, grapefruits, rambutans, watermelon, bananas, and so on.



Culture - Festival - Holidays

Viet Nam has a very rich culture, which can be seen through its various interesting art forms such as Water Puppetry and the folk songs of Cheo, Cai Luong, Quan Ho Bac Ninh, Hat Xoan, Nha Nhac Cung Dinh Hue and so on.

The festivals held yearly in many places at different times also attract many visitors as well as the researchers from all over the world.

The most important holidays for all Vietnamese people are Tet (New Year Holiday starting on Jan 1st based on the Lunar Calendar), Christmas Day, Mid-autumn Festival (Lunar Aug 15th), Independence Day (2nd Sept), Liberation Day (30th April).



Religion

Viet Nam is one of the least religious countries in the world. People here do not care much about what religion you follow. No need to worry about religion conflict. Just be friendly. The religions in Viet Nam include the Vietnamese folk religion (43/%), Buddhism (12%), Catholics (6.8%), Protestants (1.6%), Caodaism (5%), Hoahaoism (1.5%). The rest follow others or none.

Clothing

Due to the foreign influences and the diversity of its ethnic groups, the fashion styles of Vietnamese people vary from place to place. However; from the twentieth century onward most Vietnamese people have worn clothing that is popular internationally. The current formal national dress is the Ao Dai for women, suits or the Com Le for men. It is worn by receptionists and secretaries. The Ao Dai is also worn by high school girls in Vietnam. The styles differ locally in Vietnam. Vietnamese people are also tolerant to what clothes the visitors may wear.



Weather Conditions

Owing to differences in latitude and the marked variety in topographical relief, the climate varies considerably from place to place. See the table below:

Transportation and Communication

- Transportation in Viet Nam is improving rapidly in terms of both quantity and quality, which include the systems of railways, highways, ports, airports. Most of the vehicles are Japanese, American and Korean make. The German and English cars are becoming more and more popular here, too. The roads are not big but guite smooth.
- Communications in Viet Nam include the use of telephones, radio, television and Internet which is guite good and cheap almost everywhere. Wifi is available and free in most hotels, restaurants and cafés.

Health Care and Hygiene

- Health Care: Having accidents or getting sick is obviously unpredictable. In such cases, you can be well cared by the good doctors in the modern hospitals in most of the cities in Viet Nam.
- Hygiene and Food safety: Tap water is not recommended for drinking until boiled. It is only for washing and cleaning. Bottled water is safe. You do not need to worry about the food in the restaurants. But when you want to try the food in the streets, make sure that you are not eating too much in case the food may not agree with your immunity.



Security

Viet Nam is one of the safest countries on earth. Most visits to Viet Nam are trouble free but you should take sensible precautions to protect yourself and your belongings. Prevention is always better than cure! Be careful while in the crowded areas. The pickpockets are skilled at liberating your valuables from vou.

Taboos

Not many complicated rules to remember. But here are some taboos:

- Refrain from selling, buying and using drugs. The punishment is heavy
- Refrain from soliciting prostitutes
- Do not encourage people to be against the government.
- Do not try to enter military areas without consent.

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

Cultural

Central Sector of the Imperial Citadel of Thang Long - Hanoi (recognized as World Heritage in 2010)

The Imperial Citadel of Thang Long, located in the heart of Ha Noi Capital, was built in the 11th century by the Vietnamese Ly Dynasty, marking the independence of the country. It is the most important and best-preserved part of the ancient city.

Citadel of the Ho Dynasty (recognized as World Heritage in 2011)

The ancient citadel was built in the 14th century according to the Feng Shui principles, which testifies to the flowering of neo-Confucianism in late 14th century Viet Nam and its spread to other parts of East Asia. It used to the capital of Viet Nam from 1398 to 1407 and also once the political, economic and cultural centre of Viet Nam from the 16th to the 18th century. The citadel of Ho Dynasty also bears exceptional testimony to a critical period in Vietnamese and South-east Asian history when traditional kingship and Buddhist values were given way to new trends in technology, commerce and centralized administration.



Complex of Hue Monuments (recognized as World Heritage in 1993)

Established as the capital of Vietnam in 1802, Hue was not only the political but also the cultural and religious centre under the Nguyen Dynasty and the last royal dynasty of Vietnamese history, from 1802 to 1945. The structures of the Complex of Hue Monuments are carefully placed within the natural setting of the site and are aligned cosmologically with the Five Cardinal Points (centre, west, east, north, south), the Five Elements (earth, metal, wood, water, fire), and the Five Colours (yellow, white, blue, black, red).

Hoi An Ancient Town (recognized as World Heritage in 1999)

Hoi An Ancient Town is an exceptionally well-preserved example of a South-East Asian trading port dating from the 15th to the 19th century. Its buildings and its street plan reflect the influences, both indigenous and foreign, that have combined to produce this unique heritage site.

My Son Sanctuary (recognized as World Heritage in 1999)

My Son is a large complex of religious relics that comprises more than 70 architectural works, which was likely to have been constructed in the 4th century. With its great value, in December 1999, the complex of My Son Cham Towers has been recognized as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO.

Natural

Ha Long Bay (recognized as World Heritage in 1994)

Located in the northeast of Vietnam, Ha Long Bay covers an area of 43,400 ha, including over 1600 islands and islets, most of which are uninhabitated and unaffected by humans. It forms a spectacular seascape of limestone pillars and is an ideal model of a mature Karst landscape developed during a warm and wet tropical climate. The property's exceptional scenic beauty is complemented by its great biological interest.

Phong Nha-Ke Bang National Park (recognized as World Heritage in 2003)

Located in the central of Viet Nam, the property also contains and protects over 104 km of caves and underground rivers making it one of the most outstanding limestone karst ecosystems in the world. The karst formation process has led to the creation of not only underground rivers but also a variety of cave types. With a length of over 44.5 km the Phong Nha cave is the most famous of the system with tour boats able to penetrate inside to a distance of 1,500 m. The Son Doong Cave, first explored in 2009, is believed to contain the world's largest cave passage in terms of diameter and continuity. The area is also home to a large number of faunal and floral species.







Mixed

Trang An Landscape Complex (recognized as World Heritage in 2014)

Situated near the southern margin of the Red River Delta, the Trang An Landscape Complex is a spectacular landscape of limestone karst peaks permeated with valleys, many of them partly submerged and surrounded by steep, almost vertical cliffs. Exploration of caves at different altitudes has revealed archaeological traces of human activity over a period of more than 30,000 years. Hoa Lu, the ancient capital of Viet Nam, was strategically established here in the 10th and 11th centuries AD. The property also contains temples, pagodas, paddy-fields and small villages.





Village

Ancient village

However; some original villages still remain, which help people to take a journey back-in-time to a quieter area and visit the ancient Vietnamese Villages. Hill tribe Village

Vietnam has 54 different ethnics, each with their own traditional dance. The most popular performing arts are water puppetry, traditional dance and music.

- Water puppetry is a distinct Vietnamese art which had its origins in the 12th century
- Folk song of Quan Ho Bac Ninh is a type of improvisational music, which is sung a cappella and has a longstanding tradition in Vietnam, used in courtship rituals.
- Ca Tru was recognized by UNESCO as a potential Intangible Cultural Heritage.
- Imperial Court music was performed in the Vietnamese court during feudalistic times
- The Space of Gong Culture in the Vietnam Highlands is a region in Central Vietnam that is home to cultures that value gongs. The UNESCO recognized it as a Masterpiece of the Intangible Heritage of Humanity in 2005. The gong culture sees gongs as a privileged connection between men and the supernatural, where each gong houses a deity whose power corresponds to the gong's age.
